- A Panjab wire musical instrument made with the figure head of a peacock, after which it is called (Tauts).  
 A Panjab string instrument resting on two lacquered gourds, called the Bin.  
 A Kashmiri guitar, Yarkandi, Tibetan, and Dardu flutes, &c.  
 A Burma gong and striker (wrapped round with cotton ropes). Is a very pure and long sounding bell.

Attention is drawn to the numerous flutes and pipes of Zanskar (Tibet), Ladak and Dardistan as well as to the double pipe which constitutes the Yarkandi flute. The gong in the collection is an excellent specimen of bell metal manufacture.
