
GARNKIRK CHIMNEY TOPS.



After many years' use in this country, the Chimney Tops of the GARNKIRK FIRE-CLAY COMPANY have been found to resist the action of coal gas, and of wet and freezing weather. They all tend to improve the draft; and those marked as Windguards are especially useful where, with the wind in a certain direction, there is a tendency to occasional puffs down the chimney.

Their use makes the chimney a pleasing feature of a dwelling; and in many cases, at a cost no greater than that of common brick-work.

To give the best effect, the brick work should be built up a short distance above the roof. The tops may be set on the bricks, in cement or mortar, but it is better to let them into a stone cap made to cover the brick-work and project over it.
